

Visitation

We encourage families to visit their loved ones while they are on the behavioral health unit. In most instances, you decide who may visit you while on the unit. Patients do have the right to refuse/end visits if they are too upsetting. No pets are allowed, but service animals may be permitted with advance staff approval/coordination. Staff have the right to limit or refuse any visitation, and if necessary, can and will terminate any visit if the safety of the unit is in question.

Visiting Days/Hours are:

Tuesday 3:00-4:00 pm and Saturday 2:00-3:00 pm	Rooms 602, 604, 606, 608, 610, 612, 614, and 616
Wednesday 3:00-4:00 pm and Sunday 2:00-3:00 pm	Rooms 601, 603, 605, 607, 609, 611, 613, 615, and 617

Rules for visitation include following:

- The patient is allowed 1 well visitor (18 yo or older) per visitation. A well visitor is defined as having been screened appropriate for visitation based on questions related to their potential exposure to COVID-19 and symptom presentation.
- Visitors will need to arrive 15 minutes prior to visitation and asked to wait in the lobby of the 6th floor.
- If visitors arrive after the visitation time begins, they will be unable to visit at this visitation time and will have to come at next appointed time.
- Visitors will be asked to use the restroom prior to visitation as they will not be allowed to return to unit if they exit for any reason.
- Visitor will be required to wash/sanitize hands before entering the unit.
- Patient and visitor must remain mask compliant or their visitation will be terminated.
- Visitors are not allowed to bring up **ANY** belongings other than car keys. This includes cell phones, purses, jackets, etc.
- Visitors and patients will be asked to social distance.
- Visitors and patients may have no physical contact.
- Visitors are not allowed to bring food from outside onto the unit.
